<p>Literacy</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● The Storm Whale: Children will be making predictions and completing activities which encourage them to think from the perspective of the characters in the story. They will also be writing a diary entry as the main character.● Summer Poetry: children will recap the features of acrostic poetry and write their own poem about the summer season.	<p>Art</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Colour: children will learn about primary and secondary colours. They will learn about shade and tone and use this knowledge to produce an art work.
<p>Maths</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Fractions: finding halves and quarters.● Subtraction: learning the column method and borrowing.● Multiplication and division: recapping key strategies and solving word problems.● Place Value: focussing on partitioning numbers.● Statistics: tally and bar charts.	<p>Music</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Pitch, learning about high and low in music, pitch patterning, movement between pitches, scales and arpeggios and short compositions.
<p>Humanities</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Windsor Castle: children will learn about how the role of Windsor Castle has changed over the centuries and about some of the monarchs that have lived there.	<p>Punjabi and Sikh Studies</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Punjabi: Children will learn pronunciation of months and ordinal numbers.● Sikh Studies: Children will learn about Guru Arjan Dev Ji, Guru Hargobind Sahib Ji and Guru Har Rai Ji.
<p>Science</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Rocks and Fossils: children will learn how fossils can inform us about the past. They will also describe the properties of different types of rocks.	<p>Computing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● We are Musicians- Children will be using a computer to create music. They will also compare creating music digitally and non-digitally.
<p>PSHE</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Money and Work: children will learn about where money comes from, why it is needed and how working helps people to earn money.	<p>P.E</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Physical: children will learn to apply a range of skills with control and consistency. This will include passing and catching a ball in a range of ways.

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<p>Literacy</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Lila and the Secret of Rain: This story is set in Africa and relates to our geography topic. Children will be producing a non-fiction report about Kenya.• Grammar: we will conclude the year by consolidating key aspects of grammar. This will include punctuation and consistent tense.	<p>Art</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Giuseppe Arcimboldo: children will learn about this famous artist and his art work before producing a piece of their own.
<p>Maths</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Time: recapping reading the time to quarterly intervals.• Measures- recapping different units of measurement• Division- focussing on word problems• Position and Direction- learning about quarter turns, clockwise and anti-clockwise.	<p>Music</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Pitch, learning about high and low in music, pitch patterning, movement between pitches, scales and arpeggios and short compositions.
<p>Humanities</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Let's go on Safari! children will learn about Kenya including its geographical features, its people and culture.	<p>Punjabi and Sikh Studies</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Punjabi: children will learn to speak about their summer plans in the future tense.• Sikh Studies: children will learn about Guru Harkrishan Ji and Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji.
<p>Science</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Living in Habitats: children will build upon their learning of this topic from earlier in the year by learning about how habitats can change according to the season.	<p>Computing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• We are Programmers- pupils will also learn about design in programming. They will develop artwork and test it for use in a program.
<p>PSHE</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Growing and Changing: children will learn about how our bodies change as we grow. They will consider how we can deal with changes such as moving year groups.	<p>P.E</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Fitness: children will undertake activities that develop their focus and agility. They will complete floor activities that require control and balance.
