WELCOME !

- This morning we hope to inform you a little more about the Year 4 Curriculum and routines.
- If you have any questions, please feel free to ask at the end of the session.



YEAR 4 – DAILY

- Pupils are expected to line up in the playground after the bell at 8.25am, we would request parents to leave their child in the line to allow students in as quick as possible.
- Home – School Diaries to be bought in every day, they will be checked and signed on **Friday**.
- To complete their reading records **three** times a week to be signed to check on Friday.
- Swimming day is on a Monday this term for 4AM
- P.E is on a Thursday this term for 4PT
- Please ensure your child has the correct kit with them



SWIMMING

- Swimming is a compulsory element of the Primary curriculum.
- Every Monday afternoon.
- Pupils to come in with their swimming bag, containing their costume, towel and swimming hat.
- Practice putting on their hats!
- No jewellery – Kara may be worn with a sweat band.
- Extra swimming opportunities.



YEAR 4 – DAILY ROUTINES

- At the end of the day pupils will be brought outside by their class teacher. Please inform the teacher before taking your child.
- Should you wish to talk to the class teacher please wait until pupils have been dismissed.
- If someone else is collecting your child you **must** inform the school office prior to collection.
- If your personal details change please ensure the office are notified as this will affect the communication the school has with you.



YEAR 4 – DAILY ROUTINES

- We expect all pupils in full school uniform every day; should for any reason your child be missing a part of their uniform please let the class teacher know and replace it as soon as possible.
- All staff at GNSA are vigilant on uniform standards; we would appreciate in this being reinforced by yourselves as they come into school every morning.
- Please note black trainers are not part of the uniform.



HOME SCHOOL LEARNING

- Spelling test will be every Monday.
- Reading Books – All pupils should be reading every day as it is an important part of their learning. Library Books – Changed will be changed weekly on Tuesday.
- Homework days set / due are Monday, Wednesday and Friday.
- Homework should be presented to a high standard and we would appreciate this being reinforced at home.

YEAR 4 LITERACY CURRICULUM

- Self-assessment,

- Vocabulary, grammar, punctuation and spelling.
- Handwriting- it is expected to be cursive, fluent, legible and speedy.



YEAR 4 READING CURRICULUM

- Reading helps children in all areas, promoting it and making it an enjoyable experience will ensure your child develops a love for reading.
- We want every child to become an independent reader, who *choose and want* to read for their own purposes and enjoyment.
- Children need plenty of attention, support and practice with reading. Both at home, and at school there should be opportunities for:
 - Reading with children
 - Reading to children
 - Children reading aloud
 - Children reading independently.

PUPIL PREMIUM

- If you receive any of the following, the school may be entitled to receive funds on your child's behalf.

- Please complete the online eligibility check if you are in receipt of any of the following:
 - **Income Support**
 - **Income-based Jobseekers Allowance**
 - Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
 - The guaranteed element of the State Pension Credit
 - Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16, 190)
 - Working Tax Credit run on- paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit Universal Credit.
