How will my work be assessed?

The qualification is linear. Students will sit their exams at the end of their A level course.

Paper 1: Microeconomics. Examination paper: A mixture of short and long answer questions and extended response questions. Total marks – 80. Duration: 2 hours. 33.3% of the total A level marks.

Paper 2: Macroeconomics. Examination paper: A mixture of long and short answer questions and extended response questions. Total marks – 80. Duration - 2 hours. 33.3% of the total A level marks.

Paper 3: All content. Examination paper: A mixture of long and short answer questions and extended response questions. A section of MCQ's. Total marks-80 Duration -2 hours. 33.3% of the total A level marks.
